C P Brown's Legacy Inspires Duty To Uphold Telugu Literature

USPA NEWS - Former Vice President of India and Padma Vibhushan awardee M Venkaiah Naidu said that the tireless efforts of Charles Philip Brown, who revived Telugu language and literature during a time of decline, should serve as an inspiration for everyone to take responsibility for preserving and promoting linguistic and literary heritage. He made these remarks during his visit to the C P Brown Language Research Centre in Kadapa on Sunday.

Speaking to scholars and officials, Naidu praised Charles Philip Brown as "the pinnacle of English scholarship who rewrote the glory of Telugu language." He said Brown's dedication to documenting and systematizing Telugu grammar and literature at a time when the language was losing prominence remains a model for contemporary scholars and citizens alike.

Visit to the C P Brown Language Research Centre

As part of his two-day tour of Kadapa district, Naidu visited the C P Brown Literary Research Library and Janumaddi Sahithipeetham, where he explored various departments and reviewed rare manuscripts, palm-leaf records, and research works. He was accompanied by Dr. Justice Venkata Jyotirmayi Pratapa, Kadapa District Collector Dr. Sridhar Cherukuri, Yogi Vemana University Vice Chancellor Prof. Bellamkonda Rajasekhar, and several eminent scholars.

Naidu paid tribute to the statue of C P Brown, installed by the Janumaddi Sahithipeetham, and viewed a gallery of photographs chronicling Brown's contributions to Telugu literature.
